The word **Lenten** (**'Lent'** is an abbreviated form of the word) is derived from the Anglo-Saxon or Old English word **lencten** meaning the *lengthening of day light*, hence *springtime*, *spring*. Old English / Anglo-Saxon was spoken in England and southern and eastern Scotland and is the earliest historical form of the English language. It was brought to Great Britain by Anglo-Saxon settlers probably in the mid 5th century. Here follows the *Lord's Prayer* in Old English. The letter 'þ' is pronounced /th/.

Fæder ūre bū be eart on heofonum Father of ours, thou who art in heavens. Sī þīn nama ģehālgod. Be thy name hallowed. ġewurþe þīn willa, on eorðan swā swā on heofonum. manifest thy will, on earth as also in heaven. Ūre ģedæģhwāmlīcan hlāf syle ūs tō dæģ, loaf sell (give) to us today, Our dailv and forgyf ūs ūre gyltas, swā swā wē forgyfað ūrum gyltendum. And forgive us our guilts as also we forgive our guilters And ne ġelæd bū ūs on costnunge, ac ālvs ūs of vfele. And do not lead thou us into temptation, but alese (release) us of evil. Sōblīċe. Soothly [In truth > Amen).

There are many video and audio recordings on line of individuals reciting the *Our Father* in Old English. Hearing the spoken language helps w/ the written text. Check it out!
