Until Mary Bore a Son: WHETHER "UNTIL" IMPLIES A LIMITED TIME. CHRYSOSTOM: And when Joseph had taken her, "he had no relations with her until she had borne a son." Matthew has here used the word until not that you should suspect that afterward Joseph did know her but to inform you that before the birth the Virgin was wholly untouched by man. But why then, it may be said, has he used the word until? Because it is common in Scripture that this expression is used without reference to specific, limited times. Here are three examples. First, in the narrative of the ark it was said that "the raven did not return until the earth was dried up," yet the raven did not return even after that limited

time. Second, when discussing God the Scripture says, "You are from everlasting until everlasting," but there is no implication here that some limit is being fixed – rather the opposite. Third, when preaching the gospel beforehand and saying, "In His days may righteousness flourish, and peace abound, until the moon be no more!" it is not thereby setting a temporal limit to this beautiful part of creation. So then here likewise, it uses the word *until* to make certain what was before the birth, but as to what follows, it leaves some further inference to be made. So it is necessary to learn what Matthew teaches: that the Virgin was untouched by man until the birth. But the rest is left for you to perceive, both as a consequence of the previous narrative and what was later acknowledged: that not even after having become a mother and having been counted worthy of a new sort of travail and a childbearing so strange, could that righteous man [Joseph] ever have permitted himself to have sexual relations with her. PASS THE WORD: with family and relatives returning home for Christmas, who is eligible to receive the Divine Eucharist?

- (1) Any Catholic of any rite who is in good standing with the Church: V. # 3-5 below.
- (2) Orthodox who have the permission of their parish priest or bishop.
- (3) Those who attend the Divine Liturgy on a regular basis: Sundays and Holy Days.
- (4) If married, have celebrated the Mystery of Crowning.
- (5) Have received the Mystery of Holy Penance for grave sins, exempli gratia,
 - a. Knowingly and deliberately do not attend Sunday and Holy Day Liturgies;
 - b. Have publicly denied the holy Orthodox Catholic Faith;
 - c. Participate in the occult, new age practices, sorcery, divination, and the like;
 - d. Engage in theft, shop lifting, embezzlement, fraud of any kind;
 - e. Engage in drug trafficking;
 - f. Practice co-habitation, sex outside of marriage, commit adultery, incest, rape, prostitution;
 - g. Have procured an abortion; have helped one in any way to have an abortion;
 - h. Euthanasia; assisted suicide; used cremation as a denial of the resurrection of the body;
 - i. **Nota Bene:** Just because something is not listed above, does NOT mean that it may not be considered **grave** and therefore there is no need to go to Confession. If you are unsure of any possibly **grave** sin, see the priest as soon as possible!
