**From the Triodion:** «Let us strive to imitate the virtues of the Pharisee and let us follow the humble path of the Publican. In each of them let us hate excessive pride and the weight of sin.» «The Pharisee thought he would race swiftly on the chariot of virtues; but the Publican outran him on foot by yoking humility with compassion.»

This coming week culminates with the **Sunday of the Last Judgment**. In the words of *The Great Canon of St. Andrew of Crete: «The end draws near, my soul, the end draws near; yet you do not care or make ready. The time grows short, rise up: the Judge is at the door. The days of our life pass swiftly, as a dream, as a flower.»* This Sunday places before us the eschatological dimension of the Great Fast, namely a

prepartion for the Second Coming of Christ, for the eternal Passover in the Age to Come. This week is also known as Meatfare or Carnival Week when, on Sunday February 8<sup>th</sup>, we say «**farwell to meat**» at meal time until Pascha. *Carnival* is thought to be derived from the Latin: **carnis** (meat) + **vale** (farewell).

**SOULS' SATURDAYS**: On the day before the Sunday of the Last Judgment (Meat-fare Sunday) and in close connection with the theme of this Sunday, there is a universal commemoration of the dead *«from all the ages»*. Before we call to mind the Second Coming of Christ in the services on Sunday, we commend to God all those departed before us, who are now awaiting the Last Judgment. In the texts for this Saturday there is a strong sense of the continuing bond of mutual love that links together all the members of the

Church, whether alive or dead. For those who believe in the risen Christ, death does not constitute an impassable barrier, since all are alive in Him; the departed are still our brethren, members of the same family with us, and so we are conscious of the need to pray insistently on their behalf.» from the Lenten Triodion of Mother Mary and Metropolitan Kallistos

**FUNERALS DURING THE GREAT FAST**: Since the fourth century, at the Council of Laodicea (Canon 49), it has been the tradition of the Constantinopolitan Churches that the full celebration of the Eucharist, being always a festive and triumphant event, is felt to be inconsistent with the austerity of the <u>weekday</u> Lenten Fast. Accordingly the Divine Liturgies of Saints John Chrysostom and Basil the Great may **NOT** be celebrated; Monday through Friday, therefore, are known as **aliturgical days** – days without liturgy. In the event of a funeral, the Parastas and Panachida are still served at the Funeral Home as is customary, but the Funeral of a Lay Person **w/out** Divine Liturgy is served in the Church. Suffrages for the faithful departed one will be scheduled for the closest Sunday Divine Liturgy.
