<u>THE HOLY AND GREAT FAST</u>: The Great Fast is <u>our</u> penitential preparation for the Great Feast of Pascha – Passover. As such, it is one of the most ancient parts of the liturgical year, east and west. Its forty days *symbolize the forty* years the Israelites wandered in the desert after their exodus from



slavery in Egypt until their arrival at the Promised Land, while the Divine Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts is the fulfillment of the promise of the manna given in the desert, as St. John wrote, «So Jesus said to them, 'Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave bread from heaven; My Father gives you the true bread from heaven (Jn 6:32)'.» In the Great Fast, we imitate Jesus our Lord, Who fasted for forty days in the desert following His baptism in the Jordan by John. The Feast of Pascha was also one of

the key times of the church year for baptism, and so the Great Fast was time of preparation for baptism and chrismation and first Eucharist on Holy and

Great Saturday. <u>Our</u> observance of the Great Fast, therefore, is <u>our</u> renewal of our baptismal fervor.

From the Triodion: Let us offer a Fast acceptable to the Lord, for the true Fast is the estrangement from sin; no more idle chatter, no more wrath; no more evil desires, no insults; no more lying, no false oaths. If we abstain from all this, we shall keep a Fast that is indeed acceptable to the Lord.

It is an adornment, a pearl of great price, that the Church of Christ has received in the holy icons of the Savior, the Theotokos, and all the saints. Raising them on high, she shines with splendor and brightness and puts down all heresies. In joy, she glorifies God, Who by His love for us, had deigned to freely suffer His Passion.

Let us begin this second week of the Fast in joy; O faithful, let us exert ourselves from day to day, as did the prophet Elijah the Tishbite. May the four principal virtues be our chariot of fire! Let us lift our spirit by turning away from the passions, and through purity, let us struggle against the flesh, so that we may resist and conquer the Enemy.

Come, let us purify ourselves by sharing with the poor, not sounding the trumpet for our almsgiving, nor making public our good deeds. May our left hand know not what our right hand does, lest vainglory rob us of our fruit! But in secret, let us say to Him Who knows all secrets: Forgive us our trespasses, Father, in Your goodness for mankind.

A bstaining from the passion of anger, let us delight in charity without pretense. Let us feed the poor who are hungry, thus filling ourselves with the grace of God. By our tears we shall alleviate the tears of the last judgment.

The ardent **desire** of Zacchæus!
The great **humility** of the Publican!
The **self-awareness** and **repentance** of the Prodigal Son! **Love** for those in need, for the Church, for Sacred Scripture! **Forgiveness** of others!
