Timothy the Apostle of the 70. The Apostle Timothy [he who honors God] was from Lystra in Lycaonia, born of a Greek (pagan) father and a Jewish mother whose name was Eunice, and whose grandmother was Lois (II Tim. 1:15). He became a disciple of Paul - the Apostle to the Gentiles - when the latter first preached there, and he followed Saint Paul during the whole period of the Apostle's preaching. Afterwards, Timothy was consecrated bishop of the church in Ephesus. Under the supervision of John the Evangelist, who governed all the churches in Asia, Timothy completed his life as a martyr in the year 97. He was stoned to death by the heathens, because, as some surmise, he opposed the festival held in honor of Artemis the twin sister of Apollo (known as Diana among the Romans).

Upon Bishop William's enthronement on Wednesday, April 18, 2012, his name will then be included in the various litanies of the Divine Liturgy.



What is the PCC? “The Pennsylvania Catholic Conference is the public affairs arm of Pennsylvania’s Catholic bishops and the Catholic dioceses of Pennsylvania. There are 10 Catholic dioceses in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Eight are Latin Rite dioceses fully contained within the Commonwealth. Two are Byzantine Rite dioceses with Apostolic Sees in Philadelphia (Ukrainian) and in Pittsburgh (Ruthenian). Today in Pennsylvania there are 1200 parishes serving more than 3.3 million Catholics. Pennsylvania’s Catholics make up 26% of the state’s population and the Church provides 52,000 jobs. But the real legacy of the Church is in how Catholics live out the Gospel in their own communities: Catholic Charities, Education, Health Care. As we consider this strong and vibrant Catholic presence in Pennsylvania, it is easy to feel proud, but we should not feel content. As those of you familiar with the work of the PCC know, threats to religious liberty, the dignity of the human person and other issues of importance to Catholics have become frequent. We also have opportunities to make advancements that would benefit Catholic health care and education, would strengthen our service to the poor and would better enable us to live out our Gospel values. Complacency would not have been tolerated by those who laid this solid foundation over the past 200-plus years, and it should be tolerated today. And so, as we look to the public policy issues that will face us in 2012, let us be inspired by knowing that our family of faith extends across our entire state and reaches our brothers and sisters in every walk of life.”
