
This Sunday's epistle develops two ideas. The first is that we must give thanks to the Father because He has saved us from the powers of darkness. This has been a theme from the start of the *Philip Fast*. We see during this holy season how our **Byzantine Tradition** emphasizes:

• our **passing** from darkness into light,

- our **passover** from the shadows of evil deeds into the light of all that is good and right and true;
- our **pascha** from winter's cold and unfruitful works to the cornucopia of spiritual wealth filled with the Holy Spirit.

The darkness of Bethlehem's cave will yield to the luminous Theophany in Jordan's river.

AUGUSTINE: Because in Greek "to suffer" is πασχειν, for this reason Pascha has been thought of as a passion, as though this name has been derived from "suffering." But in its own language, that is, in Hebrew, Pascha means a "passing over." For this reason the people of God celebrated the Pascha for the first time when, fleeing from Egypt, they passed over the Red Sea.... And we effect a most salutary passing over when we pass over from the devil to Christ, and from this tottering world to His most solidly established kingdom. And therefore we pass over to God Who endures so that we may not pass over with the passing world. Concerning this grace conferred upon us, the apostle, praising God, says, "Who has rescued us from the power of darkness and has brought us over into the kingdom of the Son of His love." Tractates on John 55.1.
