Procession of the Honorable Wood of the Life-Giving Cross of the Lord (First of the three "Feasts of the Savior" in August) Commemorated on August 1

In the ancient world the month of August was a dangerous month! In time of old Constantinople and the whole Byzantine world the summer was far more dangerous than the winter. Homes were



small and cramped. The days and even the nights were hot and stifling. Food spoiled guickly. People became ill. The best medical practice of the day was not enough to prevent people from becoming sick, let alone able to heal them. Sometimes more was needed: prayer, fasting, almsgiving, and the healing power of the Wood of the Cross. In the Greek Horologion of 1897 the derivation of this Feast is

explained: "Because of the illnesses that occur in August, it was customary, in former times, to carry the Venerable Wood of the Cross through the streets and squares of Constantinople for the

sanctification of the city and for relief from sickness. On the eve (July 31), it was taken out of the imperial treasury, and laid upon the altar of the Great Church of Hagia Sophia [Ναός τῆς Ἁγίας τοῦ Θεοῦ Σοφίας, "Shrine of the Holy Wisdom of God]. From this Feast until the Dormition of the Most Holy Theotokos, they carried the Cross throughout the city in procession, offering it to the people to venerate."

In Eastern Europe this Feast is sometimes combined with the remembrance of the Baptism of Rus'-Ukraine, on August 1, 988. Knowledge of the day of the actual Baptism of Rus'-Ukraine was preserved in the Chronicles of the sixteenth century: "The Baptism of the Great Prince Vladimir of Kiev and all Rus' was on August 1."

In the present practice of the Byzantine Church, the Lesser Sanctification of Water on August 1 is done either before or after the Liturgy. Because of the Blessing of Water, this first Feast of the Savior in August is sometimes called 'Savior of the Water." There may also be a Blessing of New Honey today, which is why the Feast is also called "Savior of the Honey." On this day the newly gathered honey is blessed and tasted.

DORANTION PAST: The traditional rule for the Dormition Fast is a strict abstinence from August 1st - 14th, with the usual mitigations (wine and oil) for Saturday and Sunday and the Feast of the Transfiguration (6 August). It is, therefore, observed just like the Great Fast.
