He is the teacher of the Church and the herald of the divine light, the one who is immersed in the Trinity, the most beautiful adornment of holy monks, renowned for his divine contemplation and the brightness of his virtues; the pride and glory of Thessalonika; and the holy Demetrius, who relics flow with oil, shares with him the Kingdom of Heaven.

As we begin the **third week** of this holy fast, O faithful, let us praise the Holy Trinity. Let us spend the rest of the time filled with joy, and let the passions of our flesh fade away. Let us gather the divine flowers of our souls and weave a crown for the Sunday, the king of days. With crowns upon our heads, we shall praise the victory of Christ.

The ardent **desire** of Zacchæus! The great **humility** of the Publican! The **self-awareness** and **repentance** of the Prodigal Son! **Love** for those in need, for the Church, for Sacred Scripture! **Forgiveness** of others!
