During Holy Week, we do not only observe what happened in history, but through our acts of repentance, our prayers and fasting, our processions and veneration, take an active part in what we remember as having happened and what is happening now through divine remembrance. We die in Christ and rise in the fullness of life.

Kontakion, Tone 8: All brothers and sisters, who have run the course of the Fast with great wisdom and who celebrate in love the first fruits of the Lord's Passion; let us hasten to imitate the holy zeal of the virtuous Joseph. Let us fear the barrenness of the fig tree, and dry up the charms of passion through the giving of alms, that, coming with joy to the Resurrection, we may buy forgiveness from on high like myrrh, for the eye which never sleeps holds all things in sight. We have reached the time of your Passion; grant us also to venerate your Resurrection, O Savior, eye which never sleeps. Intemperance abuses youthfulness by its sweetness, chastity brings with it courage to the virtuous. This is what distinguished the just Joseph in Egypt: he feared to sin, for the eye which never sleeps holds all things in sight. Today, let us think about the cry of Jacob, let us hate the deceitful intention of his brother, but let us imitate the just Joseph, for having guarded his virtue without tarnishing it, he was delivered from all kinds of dangers, for the eye which never sleeps holds all things in sight.
