Old Testament Good Samaritans: In 2 Chronicles 28:9-15, enemy Samaritans care for Jewish victims, treating them with kindness. Note the striking parallels in this passage to the parable Jesus tells of the Good Samaritan, especialy in the following final verse 15: «And the men who were designated by name rose up and took the captives. From the spoil they clothed all who were naked among them, dressed them and gave them sandals, gave them food and drink, and anointed them. They let all the feeble ones ride on donkeys. So they brought them to their brethern at Jericho, the city of palm trees. Then they returned to Samaria.»

**ALL PEOPLE ARE OUR NEIGHBORS. SAINT JEROME**: Some think that their neighbor is their brother, family, relative or their kinsman. Our Lord teaches who our neighbor is in the Gospel parable of a certain man going down from Jerusalem to Jericho.... Everyone is our neighbor, and we should not harm anyone. If, on the contrary,

we understand our fellow human beings to be only our brother and relatives, is it then permissible to do evil to strangers? God forbid such a belief! We are neighbors, all people to all people, for we have one Father. Homily on Psalm 14 (15)
