«A man went into the forest to choose a tree from which to make roof-beams. And he saw two trees, one beside the other. One was smooth and tall, but had rotted away inside, and the other was rough on the outside and ugly, but its core was healthy. The man sighed, and said to himself: "What use is this tree to me if it is rotten inside and useless for beams? The other one, even if it is rough and ugly, is at least healthy on the inside and so, if I put a bit more effort into it, I can use it for roof-beams for my house." And, without thinking any more about it, he chose that tree.

So will God choose between two men for His house, and will choose not the one who appears outwardly righteous, but the one whose heart is filled with God's healthy righteousness. [...] In brief: the man who acts like the Publican is exalted. the first (the Pharisee) cannot be healed, because he cannot see that he is sick; the second (the Publican) is a sick man who is on the way to healing, because he has recognized his sickness, put himself under the Physician and taken his medicine. The first is like that smooth, tall three that is rotten within and is useless to the householder; the second is like that rough and ugly tree, which the householder works over, makes into roof-beams and takes into his house.»

Each new liturgical week begins on Monday and reaches its perfection with the Sunday celebration of the Divine Liturgy. This Monday we enter into the time of the Lenten Triodion and while we contemplate the message of the Sunday of Zacchæus and the Publican and Pharisee – a message of desire to see and be with the Lord coupled with the humility of the Publican – we look forward to the Prodigal Son's repentance and return from a far and distant land of exile.

#### **Topic:** «What Do I Owe My Neighbor? From St. John Chrysostom to the Catechism of the Catholic Church.»

**Dr. Michael Krom** received his Doctorate in philosophy at Emory University in 2007 and is currently the chair of the philosophy department at Saint Vincent College. In addition to his teaching and administration at Saint Vincent College, Krom is director of the Saint Vincent College Faith and Reason Summer Program. He is also a coordinator for philosophy formation at Saint Vincent Seminary. His scholarly work focuses on the relationship between philosophy and theology and on moral, economic and political theory. He has authored a book on religion and politics and continues to publish works in Catholic moral and political thought. He is currently working on a book for advanced undergraduates, seminarians and Catholic intellectuals tentatively titled, Justice and Charity: A Thomastic Introduction to Catholic Social Teaching. He has been a member of the Saint Vincent faculty since 2007.

He and his wife, Jessica, have six children and are parishioners at St. Mary Byzantine Catholic Church in Bradenville where he serves as ECF instructor. Question and Answer session included.
