A HARD WORD FINDS NO PLACE ON HARD GROUND. EPHREM THE SYRIAN: «That which fell on the rock ...». The good Lord revealed His mercy. As a thirsty deer hastens to find water (Ps. 41/42:1), so these good souls pass through the arid desert of this world, seeking to satisy their hunger and quench their thirst with eternal truth and enduring love. When dew and heavenly manna fall on such souls from Christ's lips, they bathe in joy and grow up high towards heaven, bringing forth uncountable fruit. Only one path passes through these souls: the path on which Christ walks; it is closed to all other travellers and passers-by. In these souls there are no heaps of rock or thickets of thorns, but only clean, soft and fruitful earth, on which only one seed grows: that which is sown by Christ the Lord. It says that they keep it *in an honest and* good heart. Good people do not keep Christ's word written down on paper, for paper is external to man and can be lost. Neither do they only keep it in their minds, for the mind is on the surface of a man, and it could be forgotten. But they keep it in their inner-most selves, in their hearts, in an honest and good heart, where it will not be lost or forgotten but will grow like yeast and bear fruit like wheat, making a man merry as with wine and anointing his whole life as with oil, so that it shines like the sun."
