LITURGICAL CHANGES DURING THE NATIVITY FAST. In lieu of the Sunday Resurrection Antiphons, we will sing the Typical Psalms and the Beatitudes.

THE 40 DAY NATIVITY FAST begins this Wednesday, November 15th in preparation for Christmas. This time is also often called the Philip Fast as it begins the day after the feast of the Apostle Philip on November 14th. The Gospel used that day includes Philip's invitation to his friend Nathanael to «Come and see» the One Whom Moses in the Law and the prophets wrote about! During this coming season we prepare for Christ's Incarnation and Manifestation in the flesh. It is a time in which we too are called to «come and see» Jesus more fully so as to arrive at a deeper faith in Him. These 40 days of **prayer**, **fasting**, and **almsgiving** mirror the Great Fast and provide us with the opportunity to voluntarily use these ascetic disciplines to rekindle the faith we have received in Holy Baptism. The various church services, starting with the **Presentation of the Virgin in the Temple**, already prepare us for the Incarnation. At Matins we sing *«Christ is* born – Glorify Him! Christ has descended from heaven – Receive Him! Christ is on earth – Be uplifted!» On the Feast of St. Andrew (Nov. 30): «Rejoice O Isaiah! Receive the Word of God and prophesy to us of the Virgin Mary...Bethlehem, rise up! Eden, open your gates! Magi, take the road to see your Salvation resting in the manger Who is proclaimed by the star shining in the heigth of heaven.» On St Nicholas Day, «Make ready, O Zion! The Lamb is coming bearing the Infant Jesus under her heart. Be glad, O Zion! Rejoice, O Jerusalem! Open your gates to me that I may enter and see the infant wrapped in swaddling clothes...» Sadly too many Christians are much more aware of the preparations made by stores and shopping malls for Christmas than they are of those made by the Church. Let us make every effort to start our spiritual prepartions 40 days prior to that great and holy day – the Nativity of Our Lord, God, and Savior Jesus Christ!

How to begin the Nativity Fast! Romans 12:9 – 12 offers excellent counsel: «Your love must be sincere. Detest what is evil, cling to what is good. Love one another with the affection of brothers. Anticipate each other in showing respect. Do not grow slack but be fervent in spirit; He Whom you serve is the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient under trial, persevere in prayer.»
