Soc., is on deck to present *Theological Radicalism in a Time* of Political Revolution: The Case of St. Symeon the New Theologian (949-1022) in Constantinople for the 24th Annual Lecture of the Byzantine Catholic Seminary. All are welcome to attend this lecture

virtually on **Tuesday, May 7 at 7:00 PM E.D.T.** via the Seminary website (**www.bcs.edu**). The lecture can also be accessed live or later from archives on the B.C.S. YouTube channel. In the political and military turmoil of 11th century Byzantium, the aristocratic monk Symeon the New Theologian wrote that faith ultimately cannot be taught, it has to be handed on dynamically from person to person: «Just as one candle can only be lit from another live flame.» With members of his family assassinated, and himself vindictively pursued by the emperor, the saint composed passionate songs which he titled: *Hymns of Divine Eros*. This live-streamed lecture looks at the saint's life and teachings with specific reference to this poetic and mystical masterpiece which celebrates his visions of Christ and his generous theology of God's mercy. The Very Rev. Professor John Anthony McGuckin is an Archpriest of the Orthodox Church in the Patriarchate of Romania's Archdiocese in Western Europe, Rector of St Gregory's chapel in St. Anne's on Sea, in North West England; Professor in the Theological Faculty of Oxford University; Senior Professorial Research Fellow at Emory University's School of Law, and at the St. Irenaeus Orthodox Institute at Radboud University Nijmegen.
